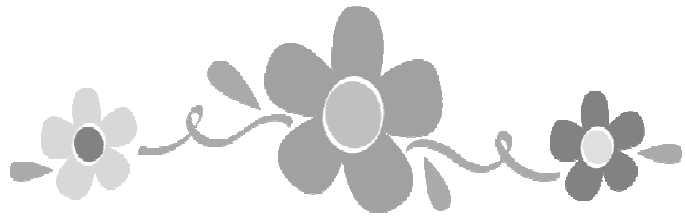


ANIMAL CARE

The township has an agreement with the SPCA which cost us \$2,639.00 a year.

The cost to the township residents for this service includes the following :

- *Dog licensing and Microchip Clinics.
- *Low-cost spay/neuter assistance programs and free spay/neuter assistance for outdoor stray cat colonies through SPCA Operations SOS.
- *Veterinary care for sick and injured animals through SPCA Second Chance Program.
- *Temporary foster and veterinary care of pets of domestic abuse victims seeking shelter.
- *Pet food for elderly residents living on a fixed income or for residents financially disadvantaged due to loss of employment or serious injuries and/or illness through SPCA Chow for our Pals Program.

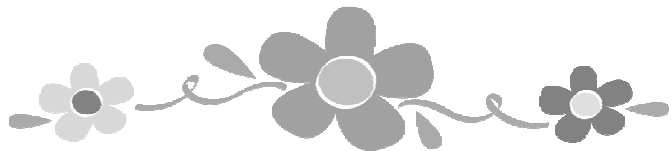

SPRING CLEAN UP

Do you have a few things laying around that the trash collector won't take? Conewago Township residents have the opportunity to bring household type items not normally picked by regular refuse collection to the Township Municipal Complex from May 4th to May 9th. Hours of operation are Monday and Wednesday from 8:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m., Tuesday, Thursday and Friday from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. Saturday hours are from 8 a.m. to 12:00 noon. Trade construction waste such as building materials, remodeling debris or waste generated as a result of a business operation will not be accepted as well as any type of hazardous waste. This includes paint, thinners, chemicals and oil. Car and light truck tires will be accepted at a fee of \$2.00 per tire and must be off the rims. You must be a resident of Conewago Township to participate in this program, so please bring along proof of residency, such as your drivers license. Materials from out side the township will not be accepted. The Township will reject any items or loads that do not meet guidelines and requirements. After hours drop off will not be permitted.

VOLUNTARY RUBBISH PICK - UP



The township is considering designating one rubbish hauler to be used within the township. The use of this hauler would be voluntary. This would provide the residents with the following:

* Approximately a \$30.00 savings per quarter to each resident using the hauler

* The opportunity for recycling in one container.

* Free pick-up of one large item each week.

Conewago Township is one of the few townships that does not provide this service. The Board of Supervisors would be interested in knowing if the community would like recycling and being able to reduce your garbage collection cost.
