



Ball fields and accessory pavilion are available on a first come basis.





Strinestown Community Fire Company is the sole provider for Conewago township. Every firefighter volunteers their time to help you in a time of crisis or in the time of need. There are two types of Members. An Operational Member is for someone who is 18 years or older that is interested in participating in fire/rescue calls. Experience is not necessary and free training is offered. A social member is for an adult that is not interested in responding to fire/ rescue calls. As Emergency calls increase, so does our need for new members. The newest advantage is the availability of the York County property tax rebate now available to first responders. 


WHEN AND WHAT PERMITS ARE REQUIRED

From time to time residents ask when do I need a permit or when is a permit required.

Many don't realize that there are various permits required for different projects.

BUILDING / UCC PERMITS

A building permit is required for all construction projects, residential, commercial, industrial and agricultural. The application should be submitted 30 days prior to actual construction. All construction projects must meet the 2018 International Residential Code for residential use and the 2018 International Building Code for commercial and industrial uses. To determine if your project is applicable call the township office .

POOL PERMITS

All residential in-ground and above-ground pools capable of holding 24 inches or more of water, require a permit, whether temporary or permanent. All pools with sides less than 48 inches high require a fence of 48 inches high. All Spas/Hot tubs require permits.

DRIVEWAY PERMITS

Permits are necessary for all new driveways. The repaving, repairing or improving of an established existing driveway require permits & Stormwater Management needs to be addressed.

STORMWATER PERMITS

All new impervious surfaces created must address stormwater i.e. sheds, garages, sidewalks, patios and pavilions. Gravel is considered impervious.


This only lists a few of the more common permits that are required. Each property owner is responsible to obtain the necessary permits prior to the start of construction. Normal hours for permits are Monday thru Thursday 7am-5pm. Please call before you stop by for permits as the Building Permit Officer may be out on inspections or code enforcement issues.

ON-LOT SEWAGE PERMITS


Sewage Permits are required for all new and repairs to existing on-lot systems.

Conewago Township's Fallen Officers Garden Labyrinth Memorial.**

Designed for healing, contemplation, and serenity the garden will function as a traditional garden labyrinth with a memorial to fallen officers that have sacrificed all in the line of duty at the center. The path is divided into three sections dedicated to one of three principles Fidelity, Honor, and Service, while the center holds a memorial.




Dating back at least 4000 years, labyrinths have been found all over the world, embraced by a wide range of cultures, religions and philosophies. Differing from mazes which feature a multitude of dead ends and false paths, labyrinths feature a single path leading to a final destination. The goal of labyrinths run the gamut from self-discovery, spiritual enlightenment, or religious symbolism, to emotional healing, communing with nature, or simple relaxing quietude.



Our Memorial Labyrinth is intended as a place of remembrance to assist our community in healing from recent losses. Construction is tentatively planned for next spring.

Conewago Stormwater Management Ordinance

#344

Effective November 6th, 2023

What is Stormwater?

Stormwater is precipitation that runs off impervious surfaces, such as rooftops, paved areas, or stone, and runs into stormdrains, sewage systems, or directly into lakes and rivers.

Why is managing Stormwater important?

Stormwater runoff picks up contaminants, such as chemicals, bacteria, or debris from every surface it crosses, and because it does not infiltrate into the soil, it is not filtered prior to entering surface, or ground waters. This contamination can lead to toxic algae blooms, bacterial or nitrogen overload, low-oxygen dead zones, and other negative impacts to local waters.

How does managing Stormwater help?

Stormwater management aims to capture water at the site and allow it to infiltrate into the soil and be filtered before it ultimately replenishes ground water aquifers or local waterways.

Who is responsible for managing Stormwater?

The property owner is responsible for controlling stormwater runoff on their property. Conewago Township directs stormwater management on the Municipal level by enforcing our Stormwater Management Ordinance through permitting and outreach. This requirement is a mandate from the United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA), Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection (DEP), and York County. Failure to comply with these mandates would subject Conewago Township as a whole to penalties from DEP, EPA, or both.

What property owners should know.

The creation of any new impervious surface requires the submission of a Stormwater application to control Stormwater runoff. Please note that gravel is considered an impervious surface. We have worked with our Township Engineer to create a Small Projects Management Guide to assist property owners in finding inexpensive solutions to stormwater management on projects under 2500 square feet.





BASIC RESIDENTIAL GUIDELINES

- Trash, Recycling and one bulk item must be curb side by 6:00 AM on your scheduled collection day.
- Bags or containers should fit within the mobile cart provided.
- Yard Waste will be collected on the first Saturday of the month, five (5) times per year. (See Calendar Above)
- Yard Waste must not exceed 5 feet in length and must be bundled.
- Call Penn Waste to schedule collection of appliances containing Freon (air conditioners, refrigerators, freezers, etc.)
- No construction debris will be collected curb side.
